

Dear Dr. Jackson:

The School of Education has recommended the establishment of an articulation agreement with you concerning transfer of students from Fayetteville Technical Community College into the Elementary Education (K-6) (BS) program at Fayetteville State University.

The agreement, which we are establishing with this letter, provides for the transfer of up to 65 semester hours credit, including General Education and courses in the Elementary Education (K-6) (BS) program. Attached is a course sequence of the courses from Fayetteville Technical Community College and courses from Fayetteville State University. The articulation agreement and course sequence have been reviewed and revised by the Education faculty at Fayetteville State University and administrators/faculty on your campus.

Please keep in mind that all courses accepted for transfer to Fayetteville State University must be taught by qualified faculty members. Faculty teaching courses for transfer must meet the standards set forth in **Criteria for Accreditation**, section 4.8.2.2 by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

After securing the appropriate signatures, please forward a copy of this agreement to me. The Elementary Education (K-6) (BS) Articulation Agreement between Fayetteville Technical Community College and Fayetteville State University will be effective as of August 1, 2001.

### **Admission to the Fayetteville State University (FSU) Teacher Education Program**

Admission to teacher education is a procedural step for students in teacher education programs. After successfully completing the requirements listed below, students are eligible to apply for admission to the Teacher Education Program. An "Application for Admission to the Teacher Education Program" form must be filed with the FSU Teacher Education Program department head by the second semester of the sophomore year. The criteria for admission are as follows:

1. Completion of the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the FSU/FTCC Teacher Education Partnership Plan.
2. A GPA of 2.5 or higher.
3. Acceptable scores on the Reading, Writing and Mathematics Tests of the PRAXIS I Series. All PRAXIS scores must be current with state mandated score requirements for admission and licensure purposes.
4. Verification by the university physician of the applicant's health status and level of physical fitness.
5. Verification by the Director of Residence Life of the applicant's acceptable deoprtment where applicable.
6. Personal fitness and the interest suitable to the profession of teaching, verified by the Center for Personal Development.
7. Screening of oral communication effectiveness.
8. Students must earn a grade of C or higher in all education courses.
9. Final acceptance for admission to the Teacher Education Program by the Teacher Education Committee, based upon documented recommendations from the major area concerned.

**NOTE:** *Prior to admission to Teacher Education, students may not enroll in more than one-half of the professional education core, excluding student teaching. No student will be permitted to enroll in methods courses prior to formal admission to Teacher Education. See each individual program for course listing.*


