SUBJECT: Huskins Cooperative Program Agreement Review for FY 2010-2011

Dear Dr. Keen:

The System Office staff reviewed your Huskins Cooperative Program Agreement to offer courses to high school students at **Cumberland County Schools and Fayetteville Christian School** for the **2010-2011** school year. The review indicates all courses are appropriate to offer to high school students as elective courses above the Basic Education Plan required courses and are approved effective **May 31, 2010**.

If you recall, the legislation enacted as Session Law 2009-451, Senate Bill 202, eliminates funding for general education courses (excluding math, science, and technology), physical education, and college success skills offered to high school students enrolled in the Huskins Cooperative Program. Please refer to the memo from Dr. Ralls dated August 10, 2009.

It is the college's responsibility to assure that courses are offered in accordance with the North Carolina Administrative Code rules and the guidelines approved by the State Board of Community Colleges and published in the *Operating Procedures for the Enrollment of High School Students in Community College Courses*. HUSKINS COOPERATIVE PROGRAM AGREEMENT

This agreement between the Board of Trustees of a North Carolina Community College and a Board of Education of a North Carolina Public or Private School System or High School is to establish a joint program of college credit courses for qualified high school students in accordance with NC General Statutes 115D-20(4), 23NCAC 2C.0305 and, NC Community College State Board approved policies and procedures, and applicable North Carolina Community College System Office numbered memoranda.

Statement of Purpose(s)

The purposes of this cooperative program agreement are (1) to make available to qualified high school students college credit educational opportunities not otherwise available; (2) to foster the effective utilization of available resources; (3) to provide for more comprehensive educational opportunities for high school students; and (4) to enhance articulation of programs and courses across the educational sectors. College credit courses offered through this agreement shall be scheduled for the enrollment of qualified high school juniors and seniors who meet the eligibility criteria

Criteria for selecting students

By mutual agreement of the governing Boards, students who participate in cooperative program courses must meet the following eligibility criteria:

1. Students must be seniors, juniors or selected sophomores who are at grade level and in good academic standing.
2. For college transfer general education courses, students must have advanced academic standing (honors students with "B" average or higher).
3. For selected college transfer general education courses, students must take the College's placement test or provide ACT/SAT/Accuplacer scores to verify eligibility for enrollment in the course.
4. Students must have completed the high school and college pre-requisite courses as identified by the College.
5. High School Principals must approve students for cooperative program courses.

Courses to be offered: (The courses will be determined through the high school registration process.)

Cost for college textbooks and other fees:

Textbook costs will be paid by the individual student. A student activity fee will be required for high school students who take courses on the FTCC campus; this fee will be paid by Cumberland County Schools or by the individual student. Tuition will be waived in accordance with G.S. 115D-5(b).

The following methods and measures will be used to evaluate the quality and effectiveness of the Cooperative Program:


- Percent of students passing the college courses with a grade of "C" or better

Supplant Statement:






