Thoracic Surgeon

Thoracic surgeons treat diseases of the esophagus, chest wall, lungs and diaphragm.

Most of these specialists work in hospitals, clinics and private practice. Their job is considered by many to be tough. They work long hours and their week can range from 60-100 hours per week.

After medical school, it takes a total of 7 - 8 years to pursue this particular professional career. Licensing for this occupation, includes graduation from an accredited medical school, passing a medical exam and a requirement of at least seven years of graduate school.



This career is an extremely high stress occupation. Men still dominate the career field, but the opportunities for women are limitless.
