

To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing in reference to your recent inquiry regarding the donation of human remains to the Department of Funeral Service Education. The study of clinical embalming is an important part of funeral service education, and we cannot overestimate the importance of your generosity.

At the time of death, we ask that someone contact Cape Fear Crematory in Fayetteville, N.C., at (910) 323-8898. They will then make the removal from the place of death and transport the remains to the college. At the conclusion of the course of study, approximately 1 month, cremation will take place. It is our practice, if the family wishes, to return the cremated remains to the family of the donor at no expense. If the family does not want them returned, the Department of Funeral Service Education will arrange burial with a local cemetery here in Fayetteville. On the enclosed bequeathal form, please check whether you wish them returned or not.

The forms that are enclosed will provide the authorization and information that will be needed to process the N.C. Death Certificate when the need arises. Please complete all items and return to me in the envelope provided.

If you should decide that this is the direction you wish to pursue upon the death, then I would suggest making copies of all the documents that I have enclosed and making members of your family aware of your intentions
