***FTCC to Host Public Demonstration of the Leica 3D ScanStation C10
to be used in Criminal Justice Department***

FAYETTEVILLE, N.C. – January 28, 2011 – Fayetteville Technical Community College will host a public demonstration of the Leica 3D ScanStation C10 that will be used in Criminal Justice classroom studies. The Leica ScanStation C10 laser scanner is an investigative resource tool for use in crime labs, coroner's offices, police, homeland security, emergency services, and the criminal justice court system. The demonstration will take place at Horace Sisk Gymnasium on Friday, February 4, at 10 a.m.

The Leica ScanStation C10 captures 50,000 measurement points per second at a range of up to 900 feet and features an internal digital camera for panoramic photography. The technology is used with crime scene investigation, vulnerability and threat assessments, post-blast investigation, police action inquiries and accident investigations, allowing investigators to view the crime scene from multiple points of view and make measurements that may not have been made at the time of the investigation. The equipment can provide juries, prosecutors, and defense attorneys with additional information about evidence, points of entry/exit, and position of the victim without the need to leave the courtroom.

“The improved technology delivered through the Leica ScanStation is expected to change the world of justice through the field of forensic science. We at Fayetteville Tech are thrilled that our Criminal Justice students will have the opportunity in the classroom to experience this cutting-edge technology and learn firsthand how changes and improvements in technology can positively contribute to the important efforts of criminal justice in our society,” said FTCC President Dr. Larry Keen.
